### Lent

## Adventures in Learning begin at St Alban's on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2023...

As you are already aware, we are continuously developing our curriculum to ensure our children are enjoying learning and make great progress in all subjects. Our outward looking mindset and relentlessness to seek better ways of doing things has led our senior leaders to visit outstanding Catholic schools within our CMAT and work beyond our Diocese with XP Trust Doncaster. An off the shelf curriculum will not cut it for our children as we want to offer them so much more based on what they need and deserve. On our mission to build something that will excite them, immerse them in a purposeful learning journey and enable them to master skills and knowledge to apply and deepen their understanding, we are trialling a new 'expeditionary' style learning...

To embark on this next journey, we will launch our whole school 'Adventures in Learning' with **OUR WORLD. WHY SHOULD WE LOVE IT?** guiding question. Teachers are planning with the end in mind and we are teaching a curriculum that focuses on what our children need now and in the future in their modern society, building on the cultural capital they bring. For example, we are not just going to learn about climate change, we are going to change the climate (where we can!) and we are not going to teach about the dangers of social media, we are going to use it responsibly.

## Adventures in Learning continued...

Every class during the Summer term will engage in 'Immersion week' where children will be going out on litter picks, watching an inspirational film or have the Mobile Zoo visit! From the immersion week, we will begin expeditions focusing on Science, Geography, English and DT (different subjects will be taught in different terms to suit which will be carefully curated in the Summer Term by our teachers for next year) using our skills across the curriculum to enhance our learning. Children will link their learning together creating a product inspired by a teacher 'WAGOLL' (What a good one looks like!) and holding a grand finale presentation, to which all parents, carers and relatives will be invited to come see the galleries, performances, premieres that our children will have curated! We will assess children in a variety of ways but also in a way that prepares them for High School and GCSEs as their primary education is only the start. We aim to nurture more successful, revolutionary learners who are activists for all that is good, starting with the good news of Jesus Christ and God's love for all of us.
