




Last week...

Friends of School fundraising

As you know our Friends of School group worked incredibly hard over Advent to raise funds for our children. As already outlined, much of this donated will be used to enable us to take children on trips and pay for visitors to school to enhance our curriculum. £1600 of the £1900 funds raised during Advent will be split across classes to reduce the cost of visits for parents and carers. This means for example, a class going on a trip that costs £19 will be subsidised by these monies reducing the contribution from parents to £12 per child on average.
