As we move from Autumn into our Spring Term, there are many more events that we ask you to attend to support your children on their learning journeys throughout the year. With support from the Diocese, Parish, Trust and Local Authority, we are awaiting further news from the DfE regarding our Nursery expansion from 9 months old starting in September 2025. As a 'new school' in September 2022, when we joined St Clare CMAT, our first inspection as an Academy school is due this academic year and with your support, we aim to demonstrate what an amazing school and community St Alban's is.
