Fluency: How does the poet, Lewis Carroll, describe the Jabberwock? Deepening: Did the hero in the poem kill the Jabberwock? Explain using evidence from the poem.</p> <p><b><u>Tuesday</u></b> <b>Read: How Doth the Little Crocodile</b> Skills: What word would we normally use instead of ‘Doth’? Fluency: Where do the crocodiles live? How do you know? Deepening: What is strange about the way that Lewis Carroll describes how the crocodile eats the fish?</p> <p><b><u>Wednesday</u></b> <b>Read: The Walrus and the Carpenter</b> Skills: What time of day was it when the sun was trying to shine on the sea in verse 1? Fluency: Why could you not see a cloud? Deepening: Who did the Carpenter and Walrus take with them on their walk? Find evidence to show that they were pleased to go.</p> <p><b><u>Thursday</u></b> <b>Read: Humpty Dumpty’s Recitation</b> Skills: Who does Humpty Dumpty send a message to? Fluency: Why do the fish think Humpty Dumpty is in a temper? Deepening: How would you continue the last line of the poem, ‘I tried to turn the handle, but ...’?</p> <p><b><u>Friday</u></b> <b>Read: About Lewis Carroll</b> Skills: What was Lewis Carroll’s real name?
